

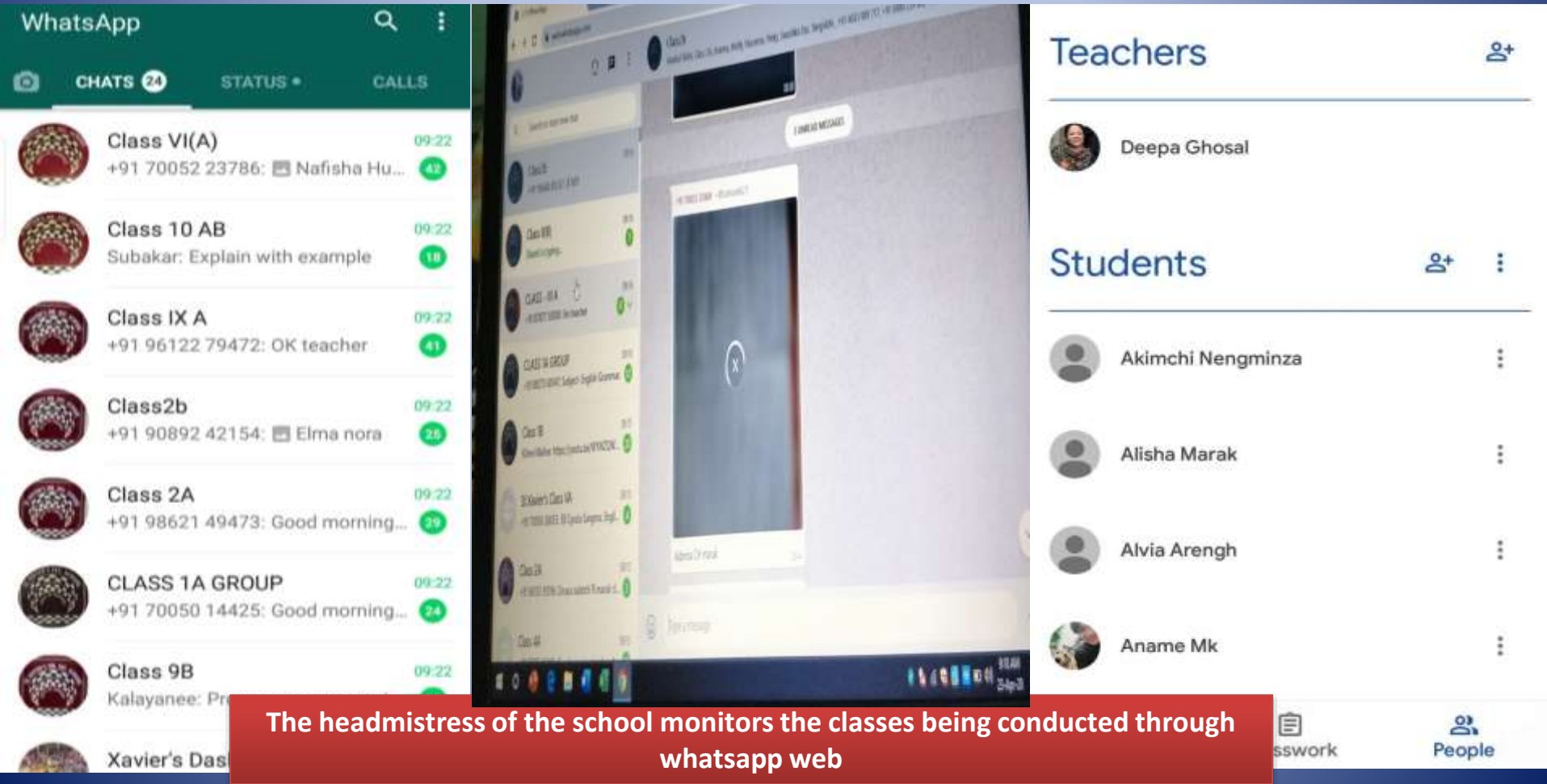

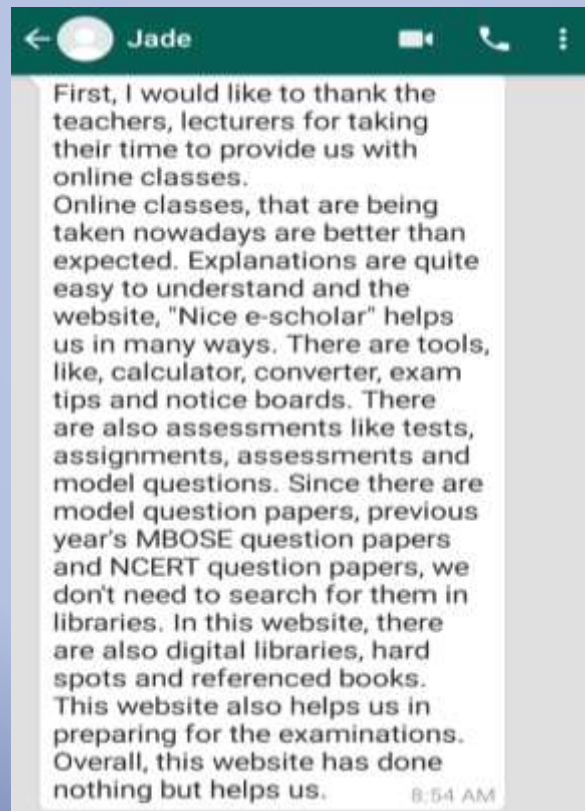
Online competition by St. Xavier's HSS for their students
